Before work began in Crete by the British archaeologist Evans at Knossos (1900), and his American contemporary Harriet Boyd at Gournia (1901-1901), knowledge of the Bronze Age Minoan culture was only faintly reflected in a few Classical Greek myths.

Evans was struck by the apparent absence of fortifications around the site and
